Increase in elder abuse – but a decrease in reporting to police

Significant support packages for citizens – CERB (\$2000 per month) plus other supports – propping up the economy

Massive increase in "benefits" frauds and scams

Austerity is coming at some point...

Increased coverage for flu shots for high dose flu and pneumonia

Background on the Issue – How is Long-Term Care Funded?

Public / Private / Municipal

Daily Housing Rate: often \$60-90, which is based on a calculation of the age and services of the building and the type of room (four-room, two-room or single occupancy).

Subsidies are available from the provincial government.

No one will be denied LTC based on an ability to pay nor can a person be evicted for non-payment of fees.

Canadian LTC Funding

The government transfers a pot of funding to provide for the "nursing" part of the nursing home budget, which covers everything that is not part of the "housing" component.

This is the same regardless of the ownership (non-profit, municipal or for-profit) of the home.

Any financial profits are supposed to be realized through additional services not covered in the socialized LTC model.



Key Differentiators





Staff – single site

Availability and prioritizing of LTC for PPE and testing

Visitors – Essential Caregivers vs "General" Visitors

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Additional staff - new "layer"
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Older vs Newer buildings - infectious spread, 'decanting' or cohorting

Connection to Hospitals for support and resident flow
